The class has been doing great at large group time! This time can sometimes get wiggly for some, but overall, it is going smoothly and their attention is on the lessons we are learning. This group, as a whole, is moving right along! This week, and moving forward, we will be focusing on name printing each day. Some already know how to spell their name. This is great! The fine motor skills needed for printing can be challenging at this age. You can help your child develop stronger hand muscles by letting them cut with child scissors, draw, explore play dough, wash dishes with you, and just about anything you can think of to encourage him/her to explore with their hands. On the reverse side you'll find an illustration and steps to the proper pencil hold. I am continually pointing out letters and their sounds to the class as we do various activates. As well as using proper descriptive words that we do not use in everyday language. Exposing the class to a wide range of language aids in building their literacy success when they begin reading. This week we are going to turn our focus to the fair and pets. I suspect there will be a lot of fair talk! It's an exciting time for children and adults alike! Last week we didn't get to the leaf rubbing activity so that is first on my lesson plans, as long as the weather cooperates and we can collect leaves. Our 18 monarch caterpillars are doing great and growing fast! It won't be long now until we see chrysalis!


Important News
