Looking back at our week before break we sure had fun with books and activities focused on March is Reading Month and our author focus, Leo Lionni. We read his book *Inch by Inch* and then Mrs. Tran did the cutest lifelike moving inch worm craft with them! Then everyone had an opportunity to measure and compare various items in the classroom that were pictured on clipboards. Everyone's chameleon turned out great too, as they picked out many different colored squares of tissue paper and then painted them on with a diluted glue mix. Mrs. Vogt was a guest reader in our room and we completed four Bingos on the Bingo Board! Everyone picked out a rock for their Leo Lionni mouse, but we didn't get to making the mice. We will do that this week. Spring is the perfect time of year for our next unit of study, plants! Our room will slowly come to life over the next few weeks as we enjoy making hairy caterpillars and hatching chicks. We will use egg cartons with soil and spread grass seed on it and then water our caterpillar's hairy back while watching the seeds slowly sprout up. This is a great living science experiment. We will have organic soil in the sensory table with plastic pots, fake flowers, shovels and gardening gloves. Pretend play will turn into a flower shop and we will have real earth worms at the science table. The class will be able to touch and look at them with magnifying glasses while learning about why they are so important to the soil. We will also get our fertilized chicken eggs in the incubator! I have plastic eggs that show what the daily growth looks like inside the egg and in 20 to 21 days we'll have baby chicks!
